

Loving God With Your Mind Pt. 2: When I consider



Opening Verses:

Jeremiah 9:24: But let him that glorieth glory in this: that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the Lord who exercises lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness, in the earth: for in these things I delight, saith the Lord.

Psalm 8:3: When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars, which thou hast ordained; what is man that thou art mindful of him, thou hast made him a little lower than Elohim.

Review

In October of 2022 I said "Lord, how do I help those with critical or longstanding conditions?" He said to me "You have to hotwire healing." How? "by speaking my creative word."

Then a year later September of 2023 I heard this phrase: words words words The golden key. And of course the spirit of God meant the word of God.

The end of last month (April) I asked

*"Lord, how do I help those that are speaking your creative word get across **the bridge** to where they are seeing what they're saying?"*

*The answer I received was: **"A believing mind."***

His answer was: "The bridge is the believing mind. Their mind must believe what **they** are saying."

The middle of May, I asked the Lord: "How do I help them have a believing mind?"

the Lord said "Just tell them to love Me with their mind. If they want to get across the bridge from declaration to manifestation. If they want to keep their mind in a believing state, tell them to love Me with their mind."

"Tell them to love Me with all their mind."

Wow! Your mind can't be in unbelief and be loving God at the **same** time!

Loving God with your mind keeps out unbelief!

Keeps your mind in a state of believing.

Young's literal: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God OUT OF all thy heart, and OUT OF all thy soul, and OUT OF all thy strength, and OUT OF all thy understanding.

Gnosis Vs. Epignosis

In the study of the New Testament, understanding the precise meaning of Greek terms is crucial for accurate interpretation. Two words that often appear related to "knowledge" are γνῶσις (**gnosis**) and ἐπιγνῶσις (**epignosis**). While both translate to "knowledge," the latter carries a significant prefix that adds depth and nuance to its meaning.

Gnosis - Knowledge

The term gnosis generally refers to **knowledge** in a broad sense. Examples:

1. A basic understanding or acquaintance with facts, information, or ideas. It's the kind of knowledge one might gain through learning or observation.

2. Knowing something or someone, but not necessarily in a deep or intimate way.
3. **Insight:** A realization or understanding that might be partial or introductory.

It's a foundational type of knowledge, but it doesn't necessarily imply a transformative or complete understanding. One can have gnosis about a subject without it impacting their life significantly.

Epignosis (ἐπίγνωσις) - Full, Complete, or Experiential Knowledge

The term epignosis is formed by adding the prefix epi. it suggests a **more profound, complete, accurate, or experiential knowledge.**

Key characteristics of epignosis:

1. **Full and Accurate Knowledge:** It implies precise understanding, often going beyond mere intellectual assent to a deeper grasp of truth.
2. **Experiential Knowledge:** It suggests knowledge gained through personal experience or intimate acquaintance, rather than just abstract information.
3. **Transformative Knowledge:** This type of knowledge is often presented as having a practical and transformative effect on one's life, leading to a change in behavior or character. ***It's not just knowing about something, but truly knowing it in a way that makes a difference.***
